

For Concurrent Enrollment Instructors

Adjunct instructors teaching concurrent enrollment courses on behalf of Mid Michigan College (Mid) may apply for educational tuition benefits for:

- Themselves, or on behalf of
- their spouse
- and/or IRS dependent children

The education scholarship includes tuition costs and fees for up to six (6) credit hours per semester. The instructors must be assigned to and working at or in a program for Mid during the semester in which the benefit is applied.

Spouse and/or IRS dependents must declare a degree program and can receive tuition funds up to a total of 62 semester hours.

Scholarship recipients must successfully complete the class(s) with a 2.0 GPA or higher.

Failure to complete the course with a 2.0 GPA or higher, NOT completing the course, dropping the course beyond the full refund date, or employee separates from instruction with Mid during the concurrent semester, will result in a reimbursement bill to the Concurrent Enrollment Instructor equal to the awarded amount for that semester. Non-payment of the reimbursement bill by the following semester de-registration date could result in the student being de-registered for the following semester.
