

Nursing Program Readmission Policy

Students that are unsuccessful in a NUR course (due to failure or withdraw) are eligible to apply for readmission to the Program. Students will be eligible the semester immediately following the unsuccessful attempt. This will result in the student switching cohorts and campuses. Once the student is accepted to return, they will remain at the cohort they are accepted back into. Readmission is NOT guaranteed. If a student is unsuccessful (either failure or withdraw) in the second attempt, they will be ineligible to return to the program.

Process for readmission:

1. Students will be ranked according to “hard points” earned in the NUR course except the first semester NUR 101 150 and 151. If there is a tie, the overall points in the course will be utilized to break the tie. For NUR 101, 150 and 151 students will be ranked in order of total points.
2. If a student was unsuccessful in both NUR courses, when readmitted they are required to take both courses (co-requisites). Example: Failed NUR 102 and 103; student must return to both NUR 102 and 103 when readmitted.
3. Determine seat availability.
4. Students submit a detailed plan of academic readiness and meet with the Dean of Health Sciences or designee to review plan and determine readiness to return.
5. When readmitted, students will be assigned a faculty mentor and will meet weekly with the faculty mentor to review their progress. Students will complete the “Weekly Summary” form; faculty will sign weekly after meeting and reviewing student progress. Students will submit the completed form to the Dean of Health Sciences at the conclusion of the semester and will become a part of their student file. Failure to meet weekly with their faculty mentor may be grounds for dismissal from the Program.
6. When returning to the Program, students are required to assure all clinical requirements are updated and current.
